Indian actress and politician Jaya Bachchan played patron on the first night of flicks at Vancouver's South Asian Film Festival.

Bachchan, who has starred in dozens of films since the 1960s, sat down for a conversation with former premier Ujjal Dosanjh Thursday. Bachchan is also a member of the Indian Parliament and the wife of legendary Indian film actor Amitabh Bachchan.
